# **Post summary**

"Internationalisation at home" (IaH) is an increasingly important priority for higher education globally. Defined as the 'purposeful integration of international and intercultural dimensions into the formal and informal curriculum for all students within domestic learning environments' (Beelen & Jones, 2015), IaH seeks to bring an exciting international dimension to the curriculum for all students, and particularly to those who cannot avail of an international study or placement opportunity as part of their studies.

We are inviting applications for a full-time researcher for a PhD project on the subject of `Embedding a culture of internationalisation into the curriculum through "Internationalisation at home": Preparing for the changing context of Higher Education in Ireland'.

The project will investigate ways to provide an international experience for all students in the emerging

Irish Technological University sector and will seek to inform strategy that will drive the development and embedding of a culture of 'Internationalisation at home' in the curriculum of the new University.

The research will involve an analysis of policy and procedures in Irish and international HEIs in relation to 'Internationalisation at Home'. It will also involve carrying out interviews and focus groups with students, academic staff, academic managers and stakeholders in order to explore, classify and discuss their experiences and perspectives of 'Internationalisation at Home' and how it is implemented.

It is anticipated that the findings of the study will identify pertinent recommendations that can be made to embed a culture of 'Internationalisation at Home' within the curriculum, in the changing context of Higher Education in Ireland with particular reference to the development of the Technological University sector.
